Pledge of Allegiance- John Socha led the pledge of allegiance.

Approval of Minutes

Minutes of the November 10th, 2022, regular meeting of the Town Board, were approved as written. A motion was made by Caryl Sutterby, councilperson, seconded by Julie Dunkelberger, councilperson. *All in favor; none opposed- Motion carried.

Open Public Hearing for Proposed Veterans Exemption Increase Local Law

The advertised public hearing to consider the adoption of the Local Law to repeal Local Law 1 of 1995 of the Town of Starkey and enact "Increase Alternative Veterans' Exemption from Real Property Taxation" for residential property of the Town of Starkey war veterans was opened at 7:02 PM by George Lawson, Supervisor. At this time George Lawson, Supervisor, opened the public hearing for discussion to the residents attending this meeting.

Open Public Hearing for the proposed NYS Uniform Fire Prevention and Building Code Local Law

The advertised public hearing to hear all interested parties on a proposed Local Law entitled "A Local Law Repealing Local Law 2 of 2007, Entitled, "A Local Law Administration and Enforcement of the New York State Uniform Fire Prevention and Building Code" and Adopting a New Local Law Providing for the Administration and Enforcement of the New York State Uniform Fire Prevention and Building Code and the State Energy Conservation Construction Code", was opened at 7:02 PM by George Lawson, Supervisor. At this time George Lawson, Supervisor, opened the public hearing for discussion to the residents attending this meeting.

NYMIR Insurance

 George Lawson, Supervisor discussed saving on premium cost if deductibles were increased. The board reviewed the schedule provided and agreed to change the deductibles to the tier 2 option presented, for an annually savings of \$1882.00.

Assessor Position (Real Property Appraisal Aide)

- George Lawson, Supervisor discussed that Yates County Personnel Department has created a new position that will allow for minimum education requirement of a high school diploma or equivalent, with 2 years of clerical experience.
- John Socha voiced concern, stating that the applicant will need to be a proficient writer, as their position requires a substantial amount of written correspondences.

PLANNING BOARD

Cluster Subdivision

• Steven Fulkerson stated that the Planning Board would like to obtain feedback regarding the proposed cluster subdivision local law submitted to the Town Board. He states that the purpose behind this proposed local law is to preserve the maximum amount of land for natural resources.

Code

• Steven also discussed the creation of overlay districts to target growth in specific areas, while minimizing the number of special use permits that need to be seen by the Planning Board.

- George Lawson, Supervisor suggests reviewing the list of allowable uses could cut down the number of planning board applications.
- Steven goes on to state that the planning board would like to begin work on the creation of an energy generation section to add to the existing code book, specifically addressing large scale solar farms and wind farms.

Veteran Exemption Local Law Board Action

- Building repair recommendation and schedule have not yet been received from Andy Harding, Architect of AJH Design
- George made the board aware of a procedural error that has created an issue for the Zoning Board of Appeals.
 Sean Socha submitted an application to the ZBA with a parcel number error, resulting in the 1000-foot notification letters being sent to the wrong group of residents, which has created a situation upsetting residents of Starkey Point Rd and Lakeview Road. The ZBA will rehear the area variance application on the 15th of this month.
