The regular Town of Starkey Board meeting was called to order at 7:00 PM by George Lawson, Supervisor.

Pledge of Allegiance- George Lawson led the pledge of allegiance.

Approval of Minutes

Minutes of the June 6th, 2023, regular meeting of the Town Board, were approved as written. A motion was made by Caryl Sutterby, councilperson, seconded by Julie Dunkelberger, councilperson. *All in favor; none opposed- Motion carried.

Public Comment

Starkey Estates and Starkey Point Residents discussed concerns with water runoff and culvert conditions. The residents discussed that during storm events, the excess water floods the trailer park and the washes road gravel on to the Starkey Estates community beach. Kathy Mihal states that the flooding has also happened in the winter. Ralph Warren states that the pipe has over time been crushed and is rusting. He recommends contacting Yates County Soil and Water for an assessment and recommendations for improvement. Ralph offered a few recommendations: replacing the culvert which would require tree removal and working with the power company or removing the pipe completely, building retention areas above the lake front. George Lawson states that the temporary/quick fix is to replace 10 feet of the existing culvert.

Assessor's Report— Tony DeStephen

- Tony reviewed the number system that is used for the Tax Map system and what the parcel numbers represent.
- Code Enforcement Report— Brian Shriver
 - Brian presented the Code Office progress report.

Highway Report— Ralph Warren

- NYS DOT has sent a letter changing the speed limit to 25 MPH on all roads in the Town of Starkey from the northern town border to the southern town border east of NYS Route 14 to the Seneca Lake shoreline. Ralph will order new signs to reflect this change.
- Ralph presented 3 quotes for a new equipment trailer. The trailer that is currently owned is a 1993 Dynaweld 10-ton trailer that when loaded is overweight, as the Roller that is hauled is 14 tons.
 - John Deere \$34,293.78
 - Jim's Trailer World \$38,826.00
 - Tracey Road Equipment \$40,617.84 (Ralph states that this trailer is available immediately).
- The tractor is currently in the shop being worked on, parts have been ordered. Julie Dunkelberger questions what the cost of renting a mower would be as she has received multiple complaints about the lack of mowing on the road shoulders. Ralph states rental cost is \$1,000.00 per week and he estimates it will take approximately 6 weeks to get the mowing caught up. He further states that this will be a slow process as the grass is thick. Julie expressed concern with the wear and tear on the mower, due to the lack of mowing this spring.

Town Clerk — Candace Iszard

- The clerk's report was presented to the board.
- Candace discussed the condition of the Town sign out front, stating that it needs repair or replacement.

Supervisor Report— George Lawson

- Regarding the building repairs, George states that Andy, provided the drawing of the repairs and quote from ACP regarding the chimney on the north wall that needs repair. George had the board go outside to look at the chimney area that is causing the issues with the water leaking into the building, stating that the chimney is no longer resting on the foundation, and is leaning approximately 4 inches away from the building. He states that ACP has quoted \$36,400, bill time and materials for the repair of the chimney, in addition to the original quote for the roofing and masonry of \$68,000. TOTAL \$104,400.00. John states that he does not think that this is a good investment, as he feels that we need to look at alternate locations, as this building needs too much work. Julie Dunkelberger asked if this is the only option? She and Candace also question "What is the guarantee that this is going to fix the problem?"
- The inverter on the solar panels at the highway barn has been replaced under warranty by Renovus.

Tablets

Candace Iszard will work with William Lawson, to get a quote on getting tablets.

Cluster Subdivision

John and Julie attended the Planning Board meeting discussing the proposed cluster subdivision regulations.
Julie discussed making it an option, but not making it mandatory on all divisions, limiting it specific zones (i.e. RR, R1, R2). John states that exempting the Agriculture Zone would be counterproductive, as the intent is to preserve agricultural land. Julie suggests that we look at what other local areas are doing, and how their regulations are designed.

 Candace stated that the website is approaching completion. The information has been retrieved from the current site. We are still looking into the benefits of the .GOV versus the existing .ORG and how we make the transition seamless for the users.
